College Profile

Established on 5 March 1964, Mrinalini Datta Mahavidyapith started its journey with the aim of catering to the expanding student population in Birati and its adjoining rural and semi-urban areas of 24 Parganas North. With the aim of making Higher Education accessible and affordable to the students coming from the lower socio-economic background, the social workers of Birati started this College under the aegis of Birati Sikkha Sansad. The College started its humble journey with ninety-five students and seven teachers, including the Principal, having provision only for Pass Course, with a limited option of subjects. The College was named after Smt. Mrinalini Devi, the mother of Sri Santosh Chandra Datta, who donated generously for the purpose.

In a span of fifty years Mrinalini Datta Mahavidyapith has evolved as a multi-faculty Degree co-educational College with Postgraduation Course in three subjects. Accredited “B++” in 2005 and “B+” in 2016 by the NAAC Peer Team, the College has tried to maintain and further escalate the heights of academic excellence and community welfare. The voyage of this Institute started with the affiliation from the University of Calcutta that continued till the academic session 2007-08. From the session 2008-09 we were brought under the umbrella of the West Bengal State University, Barasat, through the Govt order No. 300-Edn(U)/EH/1U-38/08, dated 26 May 2008.

The second phase of our journey is also packed with its own charm and adventures. In the new era, we introduced Undergraduate Honours course in 6 Science subjects (Computer Science, Physics, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology and Chemistry) and the Postgraduate courses in Bengali (2014-15), Education (2018-19) and Commerce (2019-20). With such expansion, the College now runs Honours Courses in 19 subjects and General Courses in 03 subjects in the streams of Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. Three new subjects, Microbiology, Psychology and Food and Nutrition, have been introduced from the session (2019-2020).

It is also a matter of great inspiration for the stakeholders of the College that with the catalytic intervention of the Hon’ble President of our Governing Body, the Government of West Bengal has awarded us in the year 2014 a LTS (Long Term Settlement) of 1.87 acres (112 cottahs) of land in two plots at Fatullapur, Nimta for the establishment of the Second Campus of our Institution and the Governing Body of the College has decided to introduce professional courses in the new campus. We are immensely delighted that the Second Campus of our college at Fatullahpur (Kalyani Expressway) was inaugurated by the President of our Governing Body, Smt. Chandrima Bhattacharya, Honourable Minister, Govt. of West Bengal on 9th March 2026.

The College has been able to expand its infrastructure significantly with the increasing involvement of our stakeholders. A generous patronage of Rs 20 lakhs was provided by the Hon’ble M.P. for the construction of our auditorium and we received Rs 3 lakhs from the MLA LAD fund of the Hon’ble President of our Governing Body for the development of our playground. She has also been instrumental in securing grant of Rs 18 lakhs from the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal. We humbly express our infinite gratitude, to our Honorable President, Governing Body, Smt. Chandrima Bhattacharya, for munificently donating a sum of Rs 11 lakhs, from her MLA LAD fund, for the development of the college. The newly renovated Office Room & CCTV Surveillance System of MDM was also inaugurated by Smt. Chandrima Bhattacharya, Honourable Minister, Govt. of West Bengal & President, Governing Body, MDM.

In the long stretch of fifty years Mrinalini Datta Mahavidyapith has treaded not only on a garden bestrewn with roses. The thorns pose constant threats to the wellbeing of the College as well. However, we are steadfast in our mission that is enshrined in our emblem – ‘Knowledge’, ‘Perseverance’ and ‘Empowerment’ – and we have resolved to forge ahead through the obstacles that come our way. Like that of the unrelenting hero, Ulysses, we are determined “To strive, to seek, to find, and not to yield” (Ulysses by Lord Alfred Tennyson).

Vision

The vision of the College is enshrined in our emblem which upholds the values of 'Knowledge', 'Perseverance' and 'Empowerment'. Our motto is to impart knowledge as well as to inculcate in the students the quality of perseverance that will finally empower them and make them responsible citizens of our country and the global community. We firmly believe in Cardinal Newman's central idea: "Knowledge is, not merely a means to something beyond it", it is an "end sufficient to rest in and to pursue for its own sake" (*The Idea of a University*).

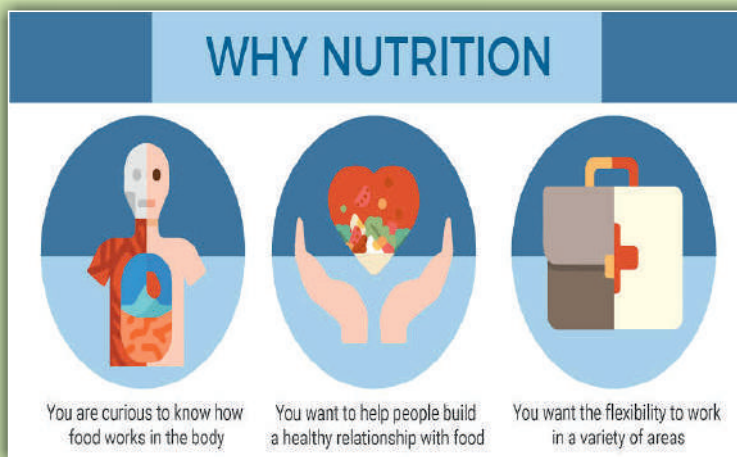

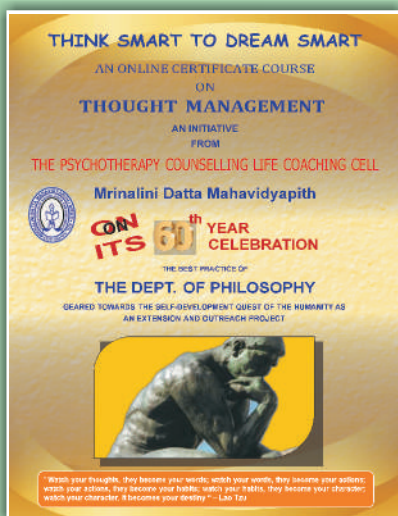

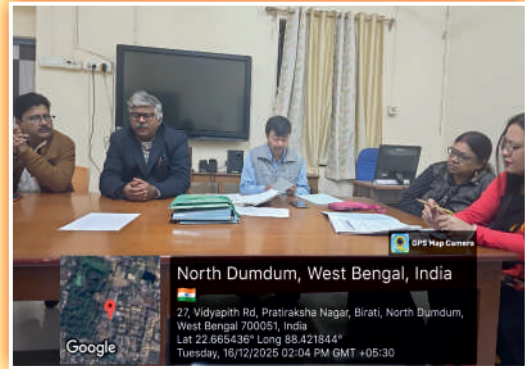

ADMISSION RULES

University Regulations for Admission to the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Honours and General) Courses of Studies effective from the Academic Session 2025-2026 based on National Education Policy 2020.

1. Scope & Coverage

The University provides following three undergraduate programmes w.e.f. the admission session of 2025-26 under the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP) based on NEP 2020 and subsequent and also in compliance with “**Recommendations of the Expert Committee to Review the Notification on the Specification of Degrees and Suggest New Degree Nomenclature(s)**” released on June 2023

A. Single Major programmes

- (i) 4-year Bachelor’s degree (Honours) with Major in a chosen discipline in the field of Arts/Science/Commerce/Management (8 semesters with 180 Credits) (See Table 1).
- (ii) 4-year Bachelor’s degree (Honours with Research) with Major in a chosen discipline in the field of Arts/Science/Commerce/Management (8 semesters with 180 Credits). Students need to complete a research project of 15 credits in areas of their Major discipline in the 4th year of studies. (See Table IA)

B. Multidisciplinary Programmes (MDP)

- (iii) 3-year Bachelor’s degree with Multidisciplinary Programme of studies in Life Sciences/ Physical sciences/ Mathematical & Computer Sciences/ Social Sciences/ Humanities/ Commerce & Management (6 semesters with 128 credits. (See Table 2)

2. Eligibility for admission in the UG Programmes:

- A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent level examination is eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of the Eight Semester B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA (Hons and Hons. with Research) or B. A. Music. (Hons. and Honours with Research) or in the First Semester of Six semester Multidisciplinary B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Programme of studies **provided he/she had English as a subject in his/her Higher secondary or equivalent level,**

- In any case, where there is an ambiguity regarding the acceptability of a particular examination as equivalent to the Higher Secondary (10+2) level of study, the matter shall be referred to the Equivalence Committee of the University who shall determine the eligibility of the said examination.

- However, no candidate, opting for Honours shall be allowed for admission in the course after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. Those desirous to do so need to seek prior permission from the University

N.B. : In all its future course of action regarding the admission procedure the college will follow the guidelines of the affiliating University (West Bengal State University). Kindly follow the college website regularly for updation of instructions and information.

authority. Students desiring admission in 3-year Multidisciplinary Program shall get a total lapse of not more than 6 years. The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. As an example, any student successfully completing Higher Secondary (or equivalent) level education in 2022 or later are eligible for admission in Honours curricula in 2025. Similarly, a student who has passed Higher Secondary (or equivalent) examination in the year 2019 or later is eligible for admission in 3-year Multidisciplinary Program in 2025.

- For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the **4-year Honours Course**, aggregate marks shall be calculated by **adding the marks of top four disciplines** in order of marks secured by a candidate. However, marks in **compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account** for calculation of aggregate marks. If the subject “Environmental Science” is studied as an elective discipline, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

- For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the **3-year Multidisciplinary UG Program of study**, aggregate marks shall be calculated by **adding the marks of top four discipline in order of marks secured by a candidate**. However, **marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account** for calculation of aggregate marks. If the subject “Environmental Science” is studied as an elective discipline, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

3. Eligibility Criteria

A candidate taking up Honours in a discipline must have obtained:

- A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the discipline or related discipline at the previous qualifying examination. In case of Music (Hons.) 45% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the discipline Music in the previous qualifying examination

OR

55% marks in the subject or related discipline in the previous qualifying examination.

OR

50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the discipline in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied

- Candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe category must have obtained 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the discipline /related disciplines at the previous qualifying examination (10+2 level) for being eligible for admission in the Honours program of study.

However, if in any Honours discipline, the number of applications is so low that even the permitted intake of the college cannot be filled up, then the Principal/Teacher-in-charge may use his/her discretionary power to relax the minimum

requirement criteria for admission in that particular discipline. A written communication in that regard must reach the Registrar for consideration of that decision for final approval by the Vice Chancellor of the University and the decision will be communicated to the Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal.

4. Candidates from other Boards

A. Students, who have passed examination equivalent to the Higher Secondary (10+2) from the All-India Boards/Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools. Students from vocational studies, are eligible for the admission in the Multidisciplinary Programme at the UG level.

B. Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All-India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) are not required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.

C. Any dispute regarding eligibility criteria would be resolved by the Equivalence Committee set up by the University or by the Executive Council in its absence.

5. Choice of Courses

(A) 4-Year UG (Honours/Honours with Research) programme of study:

Candidates will have to choose a single major discipline and any two minor disciplines and the requisite numbers of AEC, SEC, MDC & VAC along with internship as shown in Table 1 & 1(A). The combination of major and two minor disciplines for the students admitted in 4-year UG (Honours/ Honours with research) will be decided by the concerned college.

(B) 3-Year Multidisciplinary Undergraduate (UG) Programme of study (MDP):

A candidate is required to choose **any three disciplines** from **one or two broad** categories of disciplines as offered by the concerned college. (See section 7 for categories)

6. Nomenclature of Degrees

As per the UGC guidelines the given nomenclatures for degrees are to be followed until further intimation from the UGC:

(A) UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured the first 54 credits (Table 1, 1A) or have secured the first 42 credits (Table 2) will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one internship course of 2 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years. The student enrolling in 4 year UG programme will get a **certificate in UG (Major)**; similarly, a student opting for 3 year multidisciplinary Programme will get a **UG certificate in Multidisciplinary Program**. UG Certificate

will be offered in Science/Arts/Commerce as per their Major discipline in the 4-year programme or choice of discipline in the 3-year Multidisciplinary programme.

(B) UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured the first 98 credits (Table 1, 1A) or have secured the first 84 credits (Table 2) will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one internship course of 2 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years. The student enrolling in 4-year UG programme will get a **diploma (Major)**, similarly, a student opting for 3-year multidisciplinary Programme will get a **diploma in a Multidisciplinary Program**. Diploma will be offered in Science/Arts/Commerce as per their Major discipline in the 4-year programme or choice of discipline in the 3-year Multidisciplinary programme.

(C) 3-year UG Degree with Major (Honours): Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme with a Major will be awarded UG **(3 years Honours) Degree in the Major discipline** after successful completion of three years, securing the first 140 credits (Table 1, 1A) which includes 2-credit of internship. *The candidate will be awarded a BSc/BA/B. Com (3 years Honours) degree with Major in a specific subject eg. BSc (3 years Honours) with Physics Major.*

(D) 3-year Multidisciplinary UG Degree: A student after successfully completing a 3-year multidisciplinary programme by securing a total credit of 128 (See Table 2) with 30 credits from each of the three chosen disciplines will be awarded UG **Degree (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.)** which includes 2-credit of internship.

(E) 4-year UG Degree (Honours): Candidates must secure total 180 credits to obtain a Bachelor degree (Honours) in his/her major discipline (See Table1) which includes 2-credit of internship.

(F) 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 75% marks or above the first six semesters in aggregate and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. The students who secure 180 credits, including which 2-credit of internship and 15 credits from a research project/dissertation (Table 1A), will be awarded UG degree (Honours with Research). He/she should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a full-time faculty member in a substantive post (with doctorate degree) of the Major discipline concerned (or any allied discipline) of that college or an affiliated college under WBSU or concerned department of WBSU. Such candidates must submit a Thesis/Dissertation to the University for evaluation followed by a Viva-Voce examination. The concerned candidate must score 50% marks or above allotted for Research/Dissertation work to qualify for the degree of UG Honours with research in his/her major discipline.

Nomenclature of degree for 3/4-year UG Programme (Hons) will be based on the

*stream*¹ of chosen **Major discipline**. For example, if a student takes Physics as his Major he will get B.Sc. degree whereas a student taking History Major will get a BA degree. The degrees to be offered after the completion of 3- or 4-year UG programme will be B.Sc. (Hons), B.A (Hons) and B.Com (Hons).

In 3-year Multidisciplinary programme the degree nomenclature will depend on the choice of **2 Core disciplines** for example, if two of the chosen three disciplines are from categories belonging to science stream then the degree will be 3-year B.Sc. in Multidisciplinary program. Psychology, Geography & Economics will be treated as science disciplines in this context.

7. Broad Categories of Disciplines

(i) **Physical Sciences:** Chemistry, Physics, Electronics.

(ii) **Life Sciences:** Bio-chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physiology, Molecular biology & Bio-technology, Microbiology, Food & Nutrition, Fishery Science, Anthropology, Environmental Science.

(iii) **Mathematical and Computer Sciences:** Mathematics, Statistics, Computer Science, Computer Application.

(iv) **Social Sciences:** (a) **Discipline treated as Science:** Economics, Geography, and Psychology

Social Sciences: (b) **Discipline treated as Arts:** Sociology, Political Science, History, Education, and Agriculture & Rural Development.

(v) **Humanities:** English, Bengali, Hindi, Urdu, Sanskrit, Arabic, Defence Studies, Film Studies, Physical Education, Human Rights, Women Studies, Human Development, Philosophy, Journalism & Mass Communication, NCC, Music.

(vi) **Commerce & Management:** Accounting, Finance, Business Economics, Management and all other allied disciplines; Travel & Tourism Management, Advertising & Sales Promotion.

Note:

1. **Students opting for Psychology, Geography & Economics when chosen as Major discipline in a 4-year UG programme will obtain B.Sc. Degree**

2. **Categories (i)-(iv) (a) : Science stream**

3. **Categories (iv)(b) and (v) : Arts stream**

4. **Category (vi) : Commerce stream.**

9. Groups of discipline:

(A) For the 4-year UG Programme with Honours, a candidate is required to choose his/her Major in a discipline and two other disciplines for Minor courses, from among Group-I to Group-VIII as above by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned above.

(B). For the 3-year Multidisciplinary Programme of Studies, a candidate is required to choose any three Core disciplines from among the broad categories of disciplines mentioned as above by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups also in compliance with section 5(B) mentioned above.

Example, the choice of the three disciplines will have to be made as stated hereunder:

- *For B.Sc. 3-year Multidisciplinary Programme, a candidate is required to choose three Core disciplines from among Group I to VIII by taking not more than one subject from the same group and at least two science disciplines.*
- *For the B.A. 3-year Multidisciplinary Programme of Studies, a candidate is required to choose three Core disciplines from among Group I to VIII by taking not more than one subject from the same group and at least two discipline from Humanities and/or Social Sciences.*
- *For B.Com 3-year Multidisciplinary Programme at least two core discipline to be chosen from Commerce and allied discipline maintaining NEP norm.*

One cannot choose 3 disciplines from 3 different streams namely Commerce, Science and Humanities. At least two disciplines will be from the same stream and the stream from which two discipline are chosen will determine the name of the degree.

8. Mandatory Subject Requirement (at H. S. level)

A candidate shall be allowed to take up the major discipline(s) under heading "A" if he/she had passed the subject(s) under heading "B" in the previous qualifying examination. *

10. Curricular Components of the Undergraduate Programme

In accordance with NEP Curriculum & Credit Framework 2020 the undergraduate programmes governed by this regulation contain the following course components:

- **Major and Minor disciplines**

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline.

Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major

discipline.

In addition to major and minor disciplines, a student admitted in the 4-year Undergraduate programme (Hons./ Hons. with research) has to take the following courses as shown in Table 1 & Table 1A.

• Interdisciplinary Course (IDC):

All UG students are required to undergo 3 different introductory-level courses choosing not more than ONE from of the following broad disciplines given below. These courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already studied at the higher secondary level (12th class) and those chosen as major and minor discipline.

The university will provide a list of courses under the following 5 categories. Students will be asked to choose 3 different IDCs in 3 semesters from the pool of courses offered by the college.

5.	Defense Studies, Psychology, Human Rights, Education, Sociology, Political Science/ Philosophy, History, Film Studies, Physical Education, Women Studies, Music, Human Development, NCC

• Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):

Students are required to achieve competency in a Modern Indian language and in the English language with special emphasis on language and communication skills. These courses aim at enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistics skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills, that help students articulate their arguments and present their thinking clearly and coherently.

• Skill Enhancement Course:

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on-training, soft skills to enhance the employability of the students.

Each of the AEC and SEC courses shall carry 3 credits.

- **SECs for 4-Year Undergraduate Programme - Students are required to choose three SEC courses in their 1st, 2nd and 3rd semester of study. students of the 4-Year programme will take 2 SECs from the Major discipline in the first and the second**

- semesters, and a third SEC in the third semester from either of the Minor disciplines as per his/her choice.*
- **SECs for 3-Year Multidisciplinary Programme - *Students are required to choose four SEC courses in their 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semester of study. Two SECs from one chosen core discipline in 3rd & 4th semesters and another 2 SECs from another chosen core discipline in the 5th and 6th semesters will have to be taken.***
 - ***SEC 1 is to be offered in the odd semesters and SEC 2 in the even semesters. There should not be any violation of this rule to facilitate the process of registration.***
 - ***For AEC, they have to study three courses (each of 3 credits) of English and Modern Indian language (MIL) in their 1st, 2nd and 3rd semesters of study. English is to be chosen as at least one of these three courses.***
- **SEC or IDC courses shall have to be selected only from those offered by the University.**

VALUE ADDED COURSES (VAC):

These are courses that will help develop all capacities of human beings – intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner. Each of these courses carries 3 credits.

Students will be required to study the mandatory VAC (Environmental Education) in the first year. Additionally any one from the below-mentioned value-added courses (VAC) in the other semester of the same year.

The student will choose *from either of the two VACs* offered by the university as mentioned hereunder.

- **VAC2--Introduction to Cyber Security (Theoretical)**
- **VAC3-- Indian Knowledge System (IKS): Value of Yoga and Meditation (Theoretical + Practical)**

INTERNSHIP:

*A course requiring students to participate in a professional activity or work experience, or cooperative educational activity or research activity, with an entity external to the educational institution, normally under the supervision of an expert of the given external entity. **Internship is not another skill enhancement course. A key aspect of the internship is induction into actual work situations.** Internships involve working with local industry, government or private organizations, business organizations, artists, crafts persons, and similar entities to provide opportunities for students to actively engage in on-site experiential learning.*

The student has the option to complete a 2-credit internship in a research project

(of any research Institute or university or college), industrial organization, R & D lab, or through community engagement, as organized by the college. The student must complete a 2-credit internship by his/her 5th semester of study.

Note: If a student wants to leave the course with a certificate/diploma/degree, s/he should obtain the result from the college on showing the internship certificate. For a 3/4-year Honours a student should complete the internship within the first 6 semesters.

- **FINAL YEAR RESEARCH PROJECT / DISSERTATION:**

A student selected for pursuing 4-year Honours with Research programme is required to complete a research project and submit a dissertation to the University for examination and evaluation in the 8th semester. This research project/dissertation work carries 15 credits.

**** Conditions to be met by colleges offering a 4 year UG degree (Honours with Research) in a Major discipline:**

- a. The departments of the college offering a 4-year UG degree (Honours with research) must have the required infrastructure such as adequate library facility, access to internet, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out research work.
- b. A full-time teacher in a substantive post holding a doctoral degree in a discipline will be able to act as supervisor for 15 credit research projects at the UG level. Colleges with one faculty in a discipline capable for supervising the UG research project may take (if he/she considers it necessary) another co-supervisor from a different college under WBSU.
- c. If a student becomes eligible for pursuing Honours with research in a college that lacks required infrastructure and eligible PhD supervisors, he/she may complete his/ her research under the supervision of a faculty of any college affiliated to WBSU or respective department of WBSU after availing proper permission from both the HEIs and intimation to the university.

11. Marks allotted for attendance:

University has allotted equal credit-based weightage to attendance for both lab and non-lab-based discipline. Those with less than 60% attendance will be barred from appearing in the university examination and will need to repeat the semester.

12. Music as Major and Minor Subject:

- A** i) A candidate taking up Music as Major must get 45% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject Music, in the pre-qualifying examination.

OR

- ii) 50% marks in the subject Music at the pre-qualifying examination.

OR

(iii) 45% marks in aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject Music in the Pre-qualifying exam. Such candidates shall be admitted on the basis of the Admission Test/Screening to be conducted by the College Authority Concerned.

B) Music as a Core course in 3-year Multidisciplinary UG Programme: Any student can choose music as core subject and such a candidate shall be admitted on the basis of the Admission Test/Screening to be conducted by the concerned College Authority.

13. Credit hours for different types of courses:

- The workload relating to a course is measured in terms of credit hours. A credit is a unit by which the expanse of the course is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum 15 weeks).
- Each course may have lecture and tutorial component or a lecture and practicum/laboratory component or a lecture, tutorial, and practicum/laboratory component, or only practicum component. For example, a three- credit lecture course in a semester means three one-hour lectures per week with each one-hour lecture counted as one credit. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, a three-credit lecture course is equivalent to 45 hours of teaching.
- One credit for tutorial work means one hour of engagement per week. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, a one-credit tutorial in a course is equivalent to 15 hours of engagement.
- A one-credit in practicum or lab course, community engagement and services, fieldwork, Studio activities or Field practice/projects in a semester mean two-hour engagement per week. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, a two-credit practicum in a course is equivalent to 60 hours of engagement.
- A one-credit of Internship means two-hour engagements per week. Accordingly, in a semester of 15 weeks duration, 2 credit in this course is equivalent to 60 hours of engagement.
- A course can have a combination of lecture credits, tutorial credits, and practicum credits.
 - Lab-based Subject: (Total 5 Credits)
Theory-3 credits (45 Hours); Practical-2 credits (30x2=60 Hours)
 - Non-Lab-based Subject: (Total 5 Credits)
Theory-4 credits (60 Hours); Tutorial-1credit (15 Hours)

14. Duration of the Programmes:

The duration of the UG programme (Honours/ Honours with research) is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. Students may be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years. *The duration for Multidisciplinary UG Programme is 3 years.* The rule for total duration of completion of the programme is same as above.

15. SWAYAM Courses:

SWAYAM Courses: The University may allow up to 20% of the total courses being offered in a particular program in a Semester through the online learning courses offered through SWAYAM platform subject to the following conditions:

- The course contents should be alike;
- The length of the course (in terms of teaching hours) should not be less than the replaced offline course.
- The courses are not offered in the College;
- There is non-availability of suitable teaching staff to run the course in the College.

The University shall give the equivalent credit weightage to the student for the credits earned through online learning credit courses through SWAYAM platform. *However, the college will have to seek permission from the university at the beginning of the semester, if the college wants to replace regular class-teaching by Swayam course. Swayam courses will be allowed only for SEC, IDC and VAC but not for Major and Minor disciplines.*

Mechanism for Computation of Work-load:

The following mechanism shall be adopted for computation of work load in a semester comprising 15/16 weeks.

- 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration/week;
- 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration/week;
- 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hours duration/week;
- 1 Credit = Internship period of two hours duration/week

- For 3-year Multidisciplinary UG Program: Minimum Credit Requirement 126+2 (internship)

17. Course Registration:

At the beginning of every Semester, all the students shall be required to register for the Courses specified for that Semester of the Programme in the Office of the Controller of Examinations in the prescribed forms with payment of fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.

18. Post-admission Stipulations:

- Colleges have the freedom to hold any number of tests and examinations of its own students. However, colleges will not hold any elimination/qualifying test in the midway for students admitted to the different Course of Studies.
- The evaluation and assessment pattern under CCFUP based on NEP 2020 will be regulated as per provisions of the present regulation or any emergent modification published before the time of the said examinations. Any dispute regarding the above would be resolved by the relevant Examination rules and regulations set up by the University or by the Executive Council.
- It is expected that the semester examinations will be held every six months as per the academic calendar which will be duly intimated in advance by the University.

19. Foreign Nationals:

The candidate (**Foreign Nationals**) will have to show “Original Copy” of Certificate of Madhyamik (or equivalent), Certificate of Higher Secondary (or equivalent) and original Passport (along with Student Visa) at the time of admission. **Foreign Nationals will have to pay the fees five times higher than the Indian Nationals.** Their papers must be duly endorsed by the local Embassies/Consulates/High Commissions, whichever is applicable and their visa period must cover the period required to complete the course. Equivalence of the qualification obtained in a foreign country will be decided as per UGC equivalence portal.

20. College Transfer:

Transfer of candidates from one affiliated college to another will be possible as per the provisions laid out in the regulation of NEP 2020 based CCFUP system which will be in force at the relevant time. However, in all cases such transfers will be effected after due approval of the application of the candidate concerned along with requisite non-refundable fees to the University administration without contravening the provisions of the Regulation in force. *All applications for transfer have to be made to the University authority within 30 consecutive days of commencement of the relevant semester. The applications must also contain the attendance of the student in that semester.* The University reserves the right to approve or reject such applications of transfer and it cannot be treated as a matter of right on behalf of the applicant concerned.

Course Duration (For NEP, 2020)

The duration of the UG programme (Honours/ Honours with research) is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. Students may be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years. The duration for Multidisciplinary UG Programme is 3 years.
